Copyright

We would like to draw your attention to the issue of copyright laws in Great Britain and also to **Clause 6** of the publishing contract.

Clarification

Permission to use all text reproduced from the following must be obtained before publication for use in a new book.

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Reference journals
- Published books and speeches
- Lyrics from songs in the last seventy years

Please note that information from the internet or any other source in the public domain still needs to be brought to our attention for us to determine if they should be referenced.

Well-known quotations by famous people are usually originally from books, speeches and interviews and are therefore also subject to copyright laws.

Information about public bodies and well-known people also needs to be handled with due care as the way that they are referred to within the book, especially if autobiographical, may be deemed as libel.

Permission is also required for any images for use as illustration for inners and cover from the internet, published works or personal illustrators.

All references and proof of permission need to be submitted during the production process to alleviate any delay in the publishing process.

It is stated within the contract that any monies owing for copyright will be at the cost of the author and not the publisher. However, The PUBLISHER will apply for written permission from the copyright holder on behalf of the AUTHOR, to re-publish such copyright material at the AUTHOR'S expense. The AUTHOR must provide full contact details for the copyright holder.
